MiraCosta College General Education Requirements

Associate Degree Requirements

- Unit/GPA: 60 degree applicable units with a minimum 2.0 GPA
- Residency: 12 units completed at MiraCosta College
- Major: A minimum of 18 units with a letter grade of "C" or better or "P" if taken pass/no pass. **Courses may be used to satisfy a major and a general education requirement.**
- General education
- Required competencies.

General Education Requirements

- Plan A: Complete Areas A–G.
- Courses that were completed to satisfy the same general education category at another California community college will be applied to that GE area at MiraCosta College.
- Active duty military personnel and U.S. military veterans may satisfy Area E2—Self-Development on the MiraCosta College general education pattern, Plan A, through submission of a military transcript that demonstrates the completion of Basic Training or Recruit Training (DD214, DD295, or other military transcript).
- Submission of a bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited college or university may be used to satisfy general education requirements in lieu of Plan A.
- Completion of Plan B (CSU GE) or Plan C (IGETC) will also satisfy general education requirements.

Required Competencies

Reading: Reading competency **must** be demonstrated by completing **one** of the following options:

- Complete one of the following with a minimum grade of "C" or "P": Reading 100, 101; English 100, 100H, 201, 201H, or 202, 202H; or equivalent
- Present proof of **one** of the following:
 - A score of 3, 4, or 5 on a College Board Advanced Placement English Examination
 - A score of 5 or better on the International Baccalaureate Higher Level English Test.

Writing: Writing competency must be demonstrated by completing **one** of the following options:

- Complete with a minimum grade of "C" or "P": English 100, 100H, 201, 201H, 202, or 202H at MiraCosta College or an equivalent course at another regionally accredited college or university
- Present proof of **one** of the following:
 - A score of 3, 4, or 5 on a College Board Advanced Placement English Examination
 - A score of 5 or better on the International Baccalaureate English Language A1 Higher Level Examination.

Mathematics: Math competency must be demonstrated by completing **one** of the following options:

- Pass a course in Area A2 that has the prerequisite of elementary algebra, with a grade of "C" or "P" or better
- Pass a MiraCosta College mathematics course numbered 64 through 270 or equivalent with a minimum grade of "C" or "P"
- Present proof of achieving **one** of the following minimum test scores:
 - A passing score on the College Board Mathematics Achievement Test (500 Level I; 600 Level II)
 - A score of 3, 4, or 5 on a College Board Advanced Placement Math Examination
 - A minimum score of 50 on a College-Level Examination Program Subject Exam (College Algebra, Pre-Calculus or Calculus)
 - A score of 4 or better on an International Baccalaureate Mathematics Examination
 - Achieve a qualifying score on a California Community College Mathematics assessment exam that gives clear placement into a math course that requires intermediate algebra as a prerequisite or has a traceable prerequisite to intermediate algebra.

Notes: Mathematics competency can also be met through the use of multiple measures established by the college, whereby a student is placed into a mathematics course numbered MATH 102 or above or is determined to have previously completed coursework comparable to a MiraCosta course that is designated as meeting the mathematics competency requirement. Students may also satisfy each competency requirement through submission of a bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited college or university.

Petition for Degree and/or Certificate

Students who expect to receive an associate degree and/or Certificate of Achievement must file a petition by the 30 percent deadline of the final semester leading to their graduation. (Students intending to graduate during the summer intersession may petition during the spring semester.) Official transcripts from all colleges attended (or concurrently attending), approved substitutions and waivers, educational plans, and any other necessary documents must be on file in the Counseling Office before a student submits a petition to graduate. Petitions submitted after the deadline are automatically processed in the subsequent semester.

Certification of this general education pattern is not a CSU admission requirement, except when students are completing an Associate Degree for Transfer to a California State University. Students are strongly advised to work with a MiraCosta College counselor to develop an educational plan that includes general education and major preparation course work.

Credit will not be awarded for both the honors and non-honors version of a course.

Plan B Frequently Asked Questions

CSU General Education-Breadth Courses

What is CSU-GE/Plan B?

CSU-GE refers to the pattern of general education courses that students can complete at MiraCosta College to fulfill general education and admission requirements to any California State University (CSU) campus. At MiraCosta College, this pattern of courses is known as Plan B.

Is CSU-GE/Plan B required for transfer to a CSU campus?

No. An upper-division transfer student must complete 60 transferable semester units, with a minimum 2.0 grade point average. Within the 60 units, a minimum of 30 units of courses that meet general education requirements must be completed. The 30 units must include the following:

- **Area A**—9 units in the English language. One course each in Written Communication, Oral Communication, and Critical Thinking
- **Area B4**—One course, 3 units, in Mathematics/Quantitative Reasoning.

These courses must be completed with a "C-" or better or a "P" if completing pass/no pass.

Can I complete general education requirements at the CSU campus when I transfer?

Yes. If a student chooses a high unit major (e.g., math, sciences, computer science, or engineering), it may be advantageous to take courses fulfilling general education requirements at the CSU transfer campus. However, for most majors it is advantageous to complete the CSU-GE prior to transfer. Students are advised to see a MiraCosta College counselor for more information.

What is certification of CSU-GE/Plan B?

"Certification" refers to official notification from MiraCosta College that a student transferring to any CSU campus has completed courses fulfilling CSU lower-division general education requirements. To obtain full certification, a student must complete 39 units in the designated general education areas on Plan B. All courses in Area A and B4 must be completed with a grade of "C" or better or a "P" if completing pass/no pass. "Certification" means the student will not be required to complete additional lower-division general education courses after transfer. **Foreign course work is not acceptable for CSU-GE.**

Can I get partial certification on CSU-GE/Plan B?

Yes. Partial certification refers to certification by area (A, B, C, D, and E) on Plan B. To be partially certified, a student must complete all courses within an area. The CSU transfer campus will require completion of the general education requirements in those sections that are not certified after transfer.

Can Advanced Placement test scores be applied to CSU-GE/Plan B?

Yes. Most AP tests can be used to complete Plan B requirements as long as the student has earned a 3, 4, or 5 on an AP exam and is requesting full or partial area certification. Students are advised to see a MiraCosta College counselor when transferring with AP credit.

Are the approved History, Constitution and American Ideals courses required for transfer?

No. This a CSU campus **graduation** requirement. However, it is usually highly advantageous to complete this requirement prior to transfer.

Can students complete CSU-GE/Plan B course work at more than one college?

Yes. MiraCosta College will certify courses from another California community college or another CSU campus if they were approved for CSU-GE at the time they were completed. The certification placement will be in the CSU-GE breadth area approved at the college where they were completed. If the courses were completed at a regionally accredited institution that does not maintain a certified CSU-GE breadth list, the courses will be evaluated for placement by the MiraCosta College Admissions Office and Articulation Officer.

Can a course be used to satisfy a CSU-GE/Plan B requirement and a major requirement?

Yes. A course may be used for both requirements for most majors on most CSU campuses, but there may be exceptions to this rule. Please check with a MiraCosta College counselor or at www.assist.org for more information.

What if I have a mixture of quarter and semester unit courses? How is this calculated for certification?

It will be calculated to the student's advantage per area using either semester or quarter units. To convert semester units to quarter units, multiply the semester units by 1.5. To convert quarter units to semester units, divide the quarter units by 1.5.

Frequently Asked Questions**Can I use CSU-GE/Plan B to earn an associate degree?**

Yes. Certification of Plan B will satisfy the MiraCosta College **general education** and **competency** requirements for an associate degree.

What are the *other* requirements to earn an associate degree when I complete CSU-GE/Plan B?

- **Unit/GPA**—60 degree-applicable units with a minimum 2.0 GPA
- **Residency**—12 units completed at MiraCosta College.

Students who are certified with Plan B and who meet the above requirements can earn an A. A. in Liberal Arts.

- **Major**—18 units with a letter grade of "C" or better or "P" if taken on a pass/no basis.

Can I use Plan B to obtain a Certificate of Achievement?

Yes. Students fully certified on Plan B are qualified to receive a Certificate of Achievement in CSU-GE.

Petition for Degree and/or Certificate

Students who expect to receive an associate degree and/or Certificate of Achievement must file a petition by the 30 percent deadline of the final semester leading to their graduation. Official transcripts from all colleges attended (or currently attending), approved substitutions and waivers, educational plans, and any other necessary documents must be on file in the Counseling Office before a student submits a petition to graduate.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION & FOOTNOTES

This general education certification pattern can be subject to change year by year, but students are assured that courses taken to meet this pattern will be honored if they are approved for the academic year that the course is completed. **Courses on this list are approved effective Fall 2023 and are valid through Summer 2024.**

IGETC is not a UC admission requirement but is advantageous to most transfer students. Students are strongly advised to work with a MiraCosta College counselor to develop an educational plan that includes general education and major preparation course work specific to the intended UC campus. Certification of IGETC, including Area 1C, Oral Communication, is an admission requirement for the California State University system, when students are completing an Associate Degree for Transfer and using IGETC to fulfill the general education component of this degree.

All courses on IGETC must be completed with a "C" or better. A "P" (pass) is acceptable, but UC permits no more than 14 semester transferable units to be completed on a pass/no pass basis.

UC credit may be limited for some courses. For example, no credit is given for an introductory course if it is taken after a more advanced college course. Credit may also be limited for courses with overlapping content. In addition, duplicate credit will not be awarded for the honors and non-honors versions of a course. UC credit limitations are noted on the catalog course descriptions.

Courses listed in two different areas may be used in either area but not both.

Plan C Frequently Asked Questions

Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) for CSU and UC

What is IGETC/Plan C?

IGETC stands for Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC), which is a pattern of courses that students can complete at MiraCosta College to fulfill general education requirements at a University of California (UC) or California State University (CSU) campus. At MiraCosta College, this pattern of courses is known as Plan C.

Is IGETC required for transfer to a UC or CSU campus?

No. IGETC/Plan C is **not** an admission requirement for transfer to either the UC or CSU, nor does completing it guarantee admission to the campus or program of choice. IGETC may not be best for students in high unit majors such as math and sciences, and some UC campuses will not accept IGETC for certain majors. Plan C is an alternative to completing the lower-division general education or breadth program at a CSU or UC campus for many transfer students but not all.

What are the minimum UC requirements for an upper-division transfer student?

1. Complete 60 semester units of transferable college credit with a GPA of at least 2.4.
2. Complete the following course pattern requirements, earning a grade of "C" or better in each course: two transferable college courses (3 semester units) in English Composition; one transferable college course (3 semester units) in Mathematical Concepts and Quantitative Reasoning; four transferable college courses (3 semester units each) chosen from at least two of the following subject areas: Arts and Humanities; Social and Behavioral Sciences; Physical and Biological Sciences.

Completion of IGETC will fulfill the requirements listed under section 2.

What is certification of IGETC/Plan C?

"Certification" refers to official notification from MiraCosta College that a student transferring to any UC/CSU campus has completed courses fulfilling lower-division general education requirements. To obtain full certification, students must complete the entire IGETC course pattern with a grade of "C" or better in each course. "Certification" means the student will not be required to complete additional lower-division general education courses after transfer.

Can I get partial certification of IGETC/Plan C?

Yes. Partial certification for all but two (2) courses is permitted. The UC/CSU campus will require completion of the general education requirements in those sections that are not certified after transfer.

Can Advanced Placement test scores be applied to IGETC/Plan C?

Yes. Students may earn IGETC unit credit for acceptable AP scores. Applying AP credit toward a major requirement will vary by UC/CSU campus. Please see a MiraCosta College counselor when using AP credit for transfer.

Are the CSU and UC certification requirements the same for IGETC?

No. Full certification for CSU must include Area 1, Oral Communication. This is not a UC requirement. Full certification for a UC campus must include satisfaction of the foreign language proficiency. This is not a CSU requirement.

What are the other methods that can be used to meet the Language Other than English requirement for the UC? (LOTE)

Score of 3 on the Foreign Language AP test; satisfactory score on SAT II subject test; score of 5 or higher on the International Baccalaureate Higher Level Examination; score of 5, 6, or 7 on the "A" level exam; grade of A, B, or C on the "O" level exam; official records that verify completion with grades "C" or better of two years of formal schooling at the 6th grade level or higher in an institution where the language of instruction is not English; satisfactory completion of a proficiency test administered by a community college, university, or other college in a language other than English.

Does the UC have a History, Constitution and American Ideals graduation requirement?

Yes. Most students will satisfy this requirement through one year of U.S. history or one half year of U.S. history and one half year of U.S. government in high school completed with a "C" or better (UCLA requires a "B") or a college-level course.

Can I complete IGETC/Plan C course work at more than one college?

Yes. MiraCosta College will certify courses taken at other California community colleges. These courses will be placed in the same IGETC category identified at the offering college. Courses taken at other regionally accredited colleges/universities that do not have an IGETC pattern may be used on IGETC if the course is comparable to an approved IGETC course at MiraCosta College or another California community college. **Foreign course work is not acceptable for IGETC.**

Can a course be used to satisfy an IGETC/Plan C area and a major requirement? Yes.

What if I have a mixture of quarter and semester unit courses? How is this calculated for certification?

It will be calculated to the student's advantage per area, using either semester or quarter units. To convert semester units to quarter units, multiply the semester units by 1.5. To convert quarter units to semester units, divide the quarter units by 1.5.

MiraCosta College Associate Degree Frequently Asked Questions

Can I use IGETC/Plan C to earn an associate degree?

Yes. Certification of Plan C will satisfy the MiraCosta College **general education** and **competency** requirements for an associate degree.

What are the other requirements to earn an associate degree when I complete IGETC/Plan C?

- **Unit/GPA**—60 degree applicable units with a minimum 2.0 GPA
- **Residency**—12 units completed at MiraCosta College
- **Major**—18 units with a letter grade of "C" or better or "P" if taken on a pass/no basis.

Can I use IGETC/Plan C to obtain a Certificate of Achievement?

Yes. Certification earns a Certificate of Achievement in IGETC.
