Reports

Council heard reports from members of the Executive Committee

- Byrom (FA President) reported on early discussions regarding a likely bond election in 2016, the upcoming CCCI Conference (Oct. 22-24), complaints about late notices sent from A&R regarding census rosters and the updated travel policy
